What is **UKLCX**?

UKLCX is a summer school experience like no other. Building on UKLC's in-depth knowledge of junior EFL summer centres, UKLCX is our new programme for individual students and small groups.

We have re-thought many aspects of our school for individual students, including our approach to teaching and excursions, integrating exercise into students' daily routines, and giving our students greater control over their own learning. This booklet will explain many of the aspects that make UKLCX an outstanding summer experience.

Every day starts with 5-10 minutes of exercises to get students' brains warmed up for the day. They do similar exercises after lunch so that they're also prepared for their afternoon electives. In class, teachers use these exercises to help students focus and to give mini brain breaks.

In the classroom, we challenge our students to take responsibility for their own learning. Our problem-based approach to teaching empowers our students by focusing on key skills that they don't always develop in mainstream education. For 14 hours per week, students follow The English Experience, in which they receive a problem on the Monday morning and in groups they organise themselves to develop a solution by the Friday (see the next page for more details).

Excursions with UKLCX are also special. To give our students the greatest possible experience, all students get at least two full-day excursions per week - on a weekday they visit an attraction connected to the topic of that week, and the extra workshops they do there help students with their English Experience lessons. Weekend trips are more about having fun, with planned shopping time combined with engaging destinations.

Four afternoons per week, students get to choose what they want to study as they work on smaller projects and other skills not necessarily covered in The English Experience. Students follow one elective per week and these sessions are designed to be fun and practical at the same time, including such courses as News Reporters and Mini UN. After that, students have a couple of hours of activities which again they can choose, this time on a daily basis, and include sports, art, boardgames, baking, and chill-out time for those who need it.

Clifton College

Clifton Suspension Bridge

Clifton College is a boarding school in Southwest England which was founded in 1862. The buildings across the campus are a mixture of old and new and include Grade 2 listed buildings, giving this centre a real traditional English boarding school feel.

The College hosts some outstanding facilities, with 100 acres (40 hectares) of sport grounds. The English EXperience

Our main course challenges our students, building their confidence in English and many other skills. At the beginning of every week, students are given a complex problem to work through with their classmates in small groups to find a solution and present it in their chosen way.

A Course for the 21st-Century

This course empowers our students by focussing on practical, transferable, and interdisciplinary skills. We aim to provide all of our students with a deeper learning experience that will help them to cope with the many challenges of growing up in the 21st Century. As such, our courses are built around the Partnership for 21st Century Learning's three defined skill areas:

Learning and innovation skills: critical thinking, problem solving, communications, collaboration, creativity

Digital literacy skills: information literacy, media literacy, Information and communication technologies (ICT) literacy Career and life skills: flexibility and adaptability, initiative and self-direction, social and cross-cultural interaction, productivity and accountability

Students have a choice of elective courses which they follow for 6 hours per week, with classes on 4 afternoons. Where appropriate, these courses take a similar problem-based approach to Experience English, giving our students the responsibility for their own learning. The electives detailed on this page are included in the course fees, while those on the second page incur an additional fee. Please also note that not every elective will be available every week - for that reason we ask students to make a choice of three when enrolling on the course.

Public Speaking

In this elective, students:

· Investigate local environmental issues,

 Research changes to lifestyles or systems that empower students to take action,

· Choose grammar points they struggle with,

In this elective, students:

- Learn techniques for camera shots, ways of editing content, and how to speak to a camera,

Would you like to learn how authors create characters and make great stories?

In this elective, students:

- Practice techniques for describing actions and situations in various different ways,
- Learn about characters, character development, planning a story and editing,
- Write their own short stories and share them with their classmates.







Every student gets two full-day excursions per week to some of the most fascinating places in the UK. On one of those excursions, every two weeks, students will go to an outdoors adventure centre where they will build rafts, learn survival skills, and do other similar activities. All students staying for 2 weeks or longer will be guaranteed at least one trip to London, to explore a unique aspect of the capital that they probably haven't seen before. Every Sunday, those students who are not departing that week have a more relaxing day with a later breakfast and a smaller excursion around Clifton or into Bristol.

Weekday Excursions

Lion King with Disney Workshop

Feel the excitement of the West End with this trip to see one of the world's favourite musicals. First, students will have a 90-minute workshop from Disney where they'll look at various aspects of the show before going to a matinee performance and marvelling at the costumes and the dancing

Bioasis Activity Centre

The year is 2074. The climate change apocalypse means the world we call home is dying. But there is hope in rumours of a remote, natural paradise. An expedition team, sent to investigate this safe haven, is presumed lost until a radio message with a desperate plea to recruit a new generation to reconnect with nature. Education is the key, but the mission will not be easy. There will be danger, adventure, challenges to overcome and saboteurs to avoid.

Cadbury World + Marketing Workshop
Cadbury World offers a unique experience that gives
fascinating insight into the rich heritage of the UK's
favourite chocolate brand. A variety of zones showcase the
history of the company, chocolate making, and now include
the 4D Chocolate Adventure cinema experience. Our
students also get an hour-long workshop in one of
Cadbury's themed education rooms on the topic of
marketing, in which they will learn basics and more
complicated techniques to bring back to the classroom.

Houses of Parliament Guided Tour and shopping
The "mother of all parliaments" is one of the most famous
buildings in the world. A photo of 'Big Ben' is a must for
all visitors to the UK. But how many of those visitors get
to enter the building?

Our students will get to see inside the Houses of Parliament, with a guided tour of the UK's corridors of power. They will get to learn about the functioning of the Commons and the Lords, ask hundreds of questions, and afterwards go shopping around Piccadilly Circus. And yes, they'll also get their photos of Big Ben.

Weekend Excursions

BBC Earth Experience and Westfield shopping
The BBC Earth Experience, at Earl's Court in London,
take us on an unforgettable journey through the natural
world. Students will explore the extraordinary diversity of
our seven continents on the most epic scale. This
immersive journey, with narration from David
Attenborough, features breath-taking footage from
Seven Worlds, One Planet. Afterwards, there will be
time for shopping in one of London's largest shopping
malls, Westfield.

Windsor Castle and souvenir shopping
This 1000-year-old castle is the oldest occupied royal
castle in the world. It has been the favourite royal
residence for many monarchs, including Queen
Elizabeth II, and contains the personal items of Kings
and Queens from England's past. From Queen Mary's
exquisite Doll's House, through the collection of clocks
to the paintings of Rembrandt and Van Dyck, a visit to
Windsor Castle is a special experience. The shops here
sell a huge selection of souvenirs.

Bristol Graffiti Tour and Graft Workshop
Bristol is famously home to Banksy, the world-renowned
graffiti artist, and no trip to the city would be complete
without a walk around the amazing street art in the city.

But this excursion is much more than taking a few photos of some graffiti. Graft's team of mural artists will guide our students through designing their own 'tags' and trying out art with spraycans and stencils. When they leave, they take away their own stencil canvas.

Bristol Activity Tour and shopping
An outdoors activity day with an urban vibe. On the
docks at Bristol, students undertake all sorts of activities
and challenges designed to promote trust, teamwork,
self-confidence, self-reliance and raise self-esteem in
young people. Our professional partners run various
programmes of outdoor education that enrich the
lives of young people by giving them new
experiences and a real sense of achievement. The
activities encourage learning outside the
classroom and take it into exciting and
challenging new environments.
